RE: DIVISION OF CLINICAL SERVICES DIRECTOR REPORT

I. Immunization Program

A. Immunization Program Activities

1. The Immunization Reminder program provided:
 - a. 457 successful reminder calls and postcards were sent out for adults 65 years and older who are not up to date with their Prevnar, Pneumovax, Shingles and/or Td/Tdap vaccination as June 15, 2018.
 - b. 167 successful reminder calls were sent out for children 19-35 months who are not up to date with their immunizations.
2. The first Back to School planning/meeting with key SNHD participants was held June 5, 2018 with 22 attendees.
3. A total of 9,607 doses of flu vaccines were administered at SNHD facilities and outreach locations for flu season 2017-2018.

B. Immunization Program Activities

1. Mobile Unit Clinic at Windmill Library was held on June 6, 2018 and June 20, 2018; administered 39 vaccines to 19 clients.
2. Mobile Unit Clinic at Skyview YMCA on June 11, 2018 and June 25, 2018; administered 37 vaccines to 16 clients.
3. Mobile Unit Clinic at Wells Park Henderson on June 26, 2018; administered 8 vaccines to 3 clients.
4. Rural Mobile Unit Dental and Immunization Clinics in Beatty, Nevada on June 13, 2018; administered 14 vaccines to 8 clients and provided Dental services to 10 clients.
5. Rural Mobile Unit Dental and Immunization Clinics in Goldfield, Nevada on June 14, 2018; administered 10 vaccines to 6 clients and provided Dental services to 6 clients.
6. Rural Mobile Unit Dental and Immunization Clinic in Tonopah, Nevada on June 15, 2018; administered 18 vaccines to 9 clients and provided Dental services to 11 clients.
7. Rural Mobile Unit Dental and Immunization Clinics in Ely on June 18, 2018; administered 20 vaccines to 7 clients and provided Dental services to 4 clients.
Dental Services include: Fluoride varnish, sealants, cleanings and periodontal assessments.
8. Adult Vaccination Clinic for uninsured clients at the Mexican Consulate on June 18, 2018; administered 26 vaccines to 14 clients.
9. Hepatitis A Campaign for Homeless in partnership with Nevada Homeless Alliance held at the Salvation Army on June 19, 2018; administered 8 vaccines to 4 clients.

II. Community Health Nursing

A. Maternal Child Health

1. There was one new childhood lead poisoning case reported during the month of June.
2. There were four referrals from the Newborn Screening Program that required follow-up by a field nurse.

B. Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) has 122 active clients. Forty-six are participating through the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program made available through the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health under the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

Two new nurse home visitors (NHV) have completed the NFP Unit 2 education and are now prepared to enroll clients into the program. A third nurse home visitor completed the Dyadic Assessment of Naturalistic Caregiver-Child Experiences (DANCE), a mother and child interaction assessment tool utilized in the NFP program.

The Team Leader of the program will be serving as a panelist at the Nurse Family Partnership's 2018 National Symposium in September focusing on the topic of recruitment and retention of families.

C. Healthy Start Initiative (HSI)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Healthy Start program has enrolled 644 at risk participants since March 2015, when enrollment began. 171 infants have been born into the program since March 2015. At present, four case managers and a team lead are serving 205 participants total.

III. HIV/Ryan White Care Programs

- A. Three pregnant women and four newborns with perinatal HIV exposure were referred to the medical case management program in the month of June. Infants perinatally exposed to HIV are followed for periodic HIV screening until cleared, at approximately 4 months of age.
- B. One new medical case manager started orientation in the Ryan White program.

IV. Sexual Health Clinic (STD Care Services)

- A. The Sexual Health Clinic (SHC) provided direct clinical services to 1367 clients this month.
- B. The SHC scaled up its Pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) project in the month of June. There were 18 appointments for labs and 17 patients were seen by a provider and either initiated or continued PrEP.
- C. The SHC will continue to offer Hepatitis testing. There have been five patients diagnosed with Hepatitis C and two patients diagnosed with Hepatitis B since Hepatitis screening was introduced at the SHC in May 2018. Cases are referred to Health District infectious disease provider and/or referred back to their medical home if they choose.

V. Tuberculosis Clinic/Refugee Health Program

- A. Five new active adult TB cases, and no new pediatric cases were reported by the TB Clinic during this period.
- B. The Refugee Health Program served 28 Adult and 4 Pediatric patients.

VI. Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP)

- A. The TPP program and grant partners continue full program and grant activities at the Juvenile Justice System, Department of Family Services and other community based organizations.
- B. Special Projects, Reports/Events: During June, the TPP program participated in the Latino Youth Conference at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. There were 75 conference participants who received information about family planning services, sexual health and resources.
- C. The TPP program's social media campaign for May included the THNKnevada Facebook page which achieved a total of 18 new likes with 1,004 individuals engaged in it. The Twitter account reached 727 followers and had 228 impressions. The THNK website had 146 unique users, 74 new users and 22 returning users. The Instagram page reached 736 followers and 96 youth were engaged.

VII. Family Planning (FP)

- A. FP Program services at East Las Vegas and Decatur Public Health Centers served 614 clients; 584 of them were unduplicated.
- B. The East Las Vegas Family Planning Clinic served 360 clients; 346 of them were unduplicated.
- C. The Decatur Family Planning clinic served 254 clients; 238 of them unduplicated.

VIII. Family Health Clinic

- A. The Family Health Clinic performed 9 exams for clients seeking school and employment physicals and children preventive health services for June 2018.

IV. Pharmacy Services

- A. Dispensed 263 prescriptions filled for 185 clients.
- B. Assessed/counseled 26 clients in the Ryan White-Sexual Health Clinic.
- C. Assessed/counseled 30 clients in the Tuberculosis Clinic.
- D. Assisted 20 clients to obtain medication financial assistance.
- E. Assisted 5 clients with insurance approvals.
- F. Referred 0 clients to community partners.

X. Clinical Services Administration

- A. Nevada State College, Roseman University and Touro University and University of Nevada School of Medicine had scheduled SNHD Clinical Services rotations.
- B. Clinical Services Division continues to retain Nevada State Board of Nursing approval to provide Continuing Education credits for SNHD Nursing staff. There were no CEU's offered in June.
